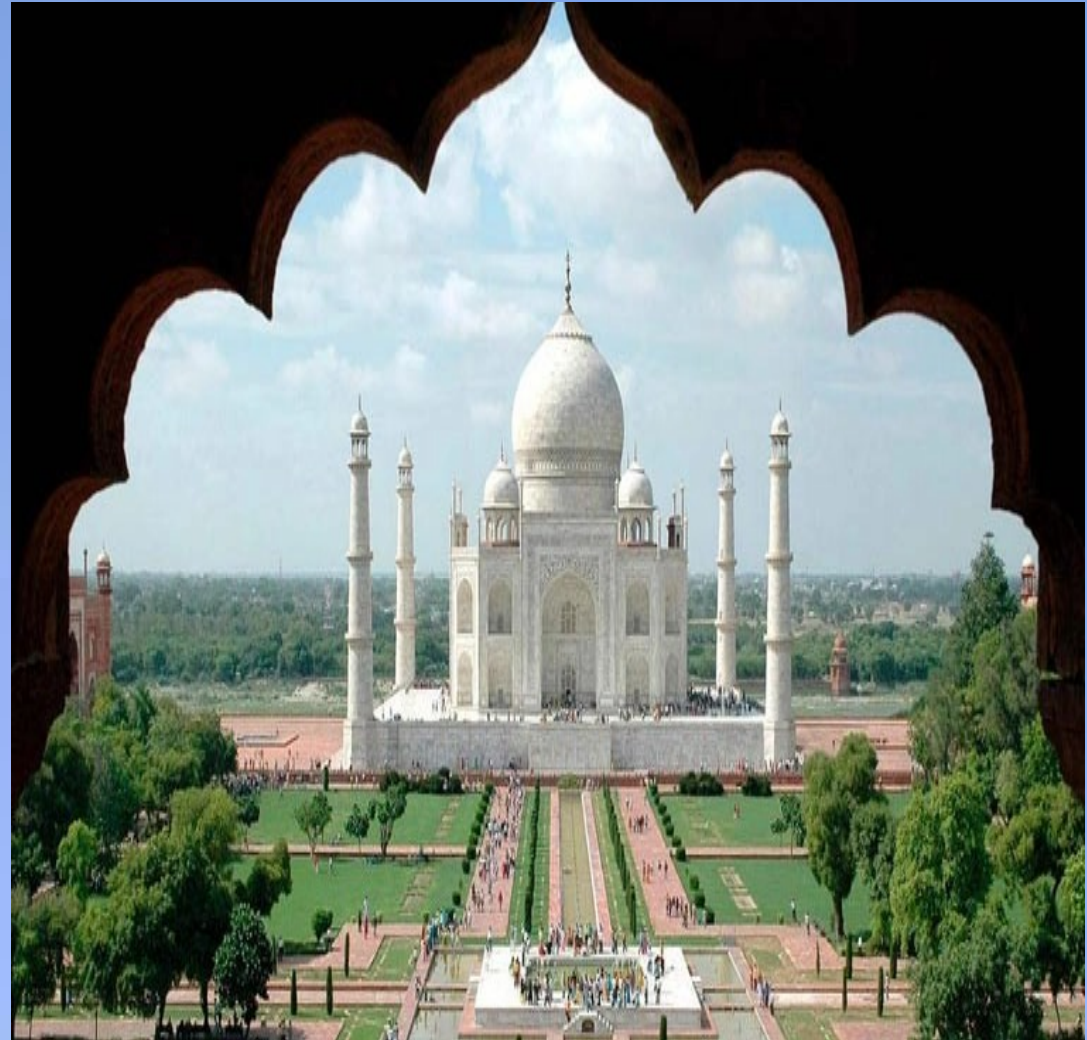
Introduction

- . Built by Mughal Emperor Shah Jahan in memory of his wife Mumtaz Mahal.



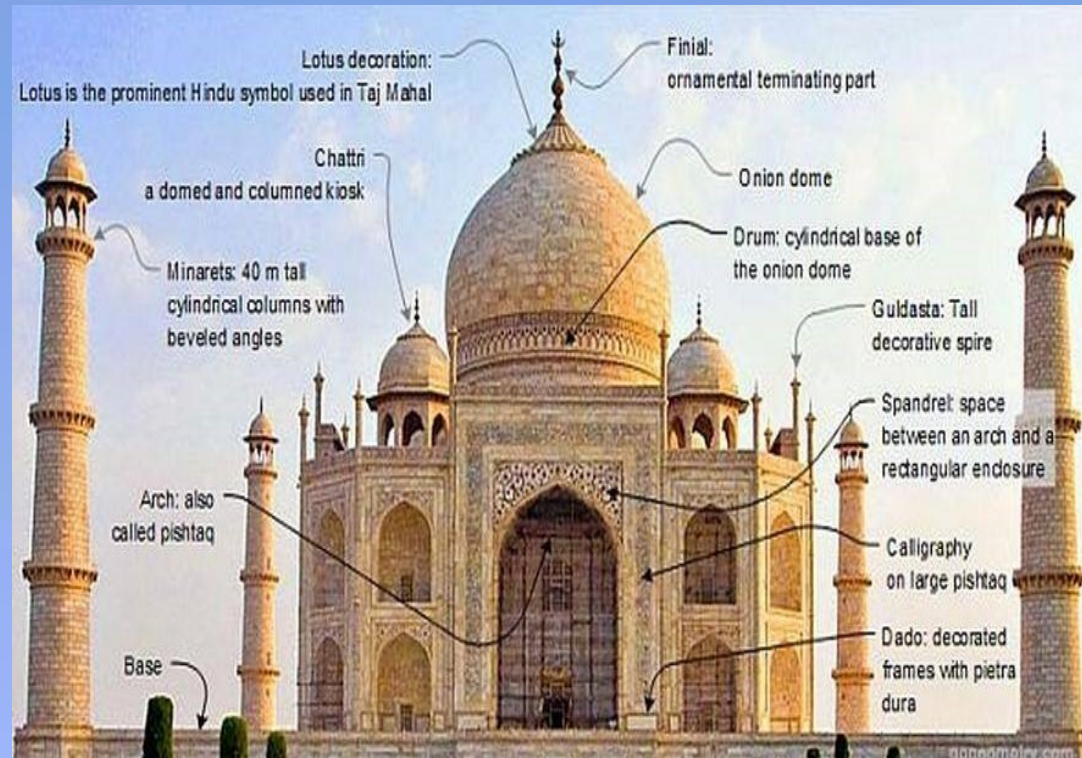
Historical Background
